# A Note from Niki...

It's actually about the lamb! What is?

Well, there isn't much that gets me hotter under the collar than someone attacking my "Sacred Cows". One of those "Sacred Cows", is the Christian feast days. I'm so very much over the arguments from Christians as well as others, who want to shout that these are actually pagan festivals.

Saint Paul's letter to the Romans tells us, in chapter 14, verse 5 "One person regards a certain day above the others, while someone else considers every day alike. Each one should be fully convinced in his own mind. He who observes a special day does so to the Lord; he who eats does so to the Lord, for he gives thanks to God; and he

who abstains does so to the Lord and gives thanks to God...."

My father is Maltese. About 95% of Malta are devout Catholics and going to church is part of life. Feast days are part of life. They tell the story of our faith and immerse us in the message of the Gospel. We don't just hear the story, but we become involved in it... taking up fasting and prayer as we follow the stories of Jesus as he prepared to die for the sins of the world.

The word, Easter is most certainly tied up in paganism – associated with the goddess of Spring, and yet for centuries it lost that understanding as the Christian church adopted the term with their new understanding that Christ came and died to bring us new life. Yes, Easter is about New Life. As a Christian we know that Jesus brings us New Life. He has brought us from the death of separation from God, to the glorious resurrection and hope for life eternal. We can't possibly see Easter any other way.

Rabbits and Eggs are symbols of abundant life. Modern children have sadly lost out. They don't know Easter the way that I did as a child. We hide the ugliness of Jesus suffering from them, thinking that it is too harsh for them and in doing so, we rob them of a rich and wonderful experience.

So many young people are lost in what they see as the meaninglessness of life ... We have robed them of knowing the truth about the abundant, eternal life that was bought at a price. They have the symbols of life, but without Jesus it is simply chocolate that melts in the sunshine.

To rejoice in the truth of Easter we perhaps need to adopt the Italian Easter greeting of Buona Pasqua. This word has its foundations in meaning the PASSOVER, referring to the event of the Angel of death passing over the Israelites when they were slaves in Egypt. They were passed over because there was blood from the Passover lamb painted over the doors of their houses. The lamb literally saved them from death and Jesus is our lamb of God – sacrificed to bring us life... TRUE life and abundant life. What can we give in return? Jesus is the innocent lamb who died – BUT he rose

from the grave, proving his divinity. Buona Pasqua! It's all about the lamb.
